SAGINAW COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH RECOGNIZES WORLD AIDS DAY

December 1, 2017 is World AIDS Day and serves as an opportunity to raise public awareness and improve education about HIV and AIDS. In the United States, there are 1.1 million people living with HIV and 1 in 7 of them don't know it. The estimated prevalence of HIV in the State of Michigan is 17,970. In Saginaw County, that number is 290 residents.

The only way to know for sure whether or not you have HIV is to get tested. You could have HIV and still feel healthy. Everyone ages 15 to 65 needs to get tested at least once. Some people may need to be tested more often. HIV is passed from one person to another by:

- Having unprotected sex with a person who has HIV
- Sharing needles with someone who has HIV
- Breastfeeding, pregnancy, or childbirth if the mother has HIV
- Getting a transfusion of blood that's infected with HIV (very rare in the United States)
